

## IMTA ALUM EVA LONGORIA RETURNS TO SERIES TV IN "TELANOVELA"

"Telenovela" sneak peek on Monday, December 7 on NBC, 10ET/9CT

"The way these writers write is my kind of funny. I love physical comedy — I love big, broad comedies that can appeal to everyone and that deal with universal themes. The world we're in is specific, but the themes we deal with are pretty universal." – Eva Longoria

Since "Desperate Housewives" ended its eight-year run in 2012, IMTA alum Eva Longoria has filled her time producing ("Devious Maids," John Wick, Food Chains), starring in feature films (Any Day, Frontera, Visions), and doing occasional guest appearances on TV ("Brooklyn Nine-Nine," "The Simpsons," "Mother Up"). She is set to return to prime-time TV in January with the ensemble comedy "Telenovela," that goes behind the scenes of a Spanish-language TV show and its

star, whose off-camera life rivals the drama of her on-screen story lines. As a teaser for the series, which will move to its regular Monday spot on January 4<sup>th</sup> at 8:30pm, NBC offers a 2-episode sneak peak of the show tonight.

Longoria is in the role of Ana Sophia, the star of the long-running Spanish-language soap, who tries to hide the fact that she can't actually speak Spanish. In an effort to boost the ratings of the show, the handsome network chief re-unites her with her TV star ex-



husband who supposedly cheated on her with Shakira. The ensemble also includes the show's one-time ingénue who has been moved toward mother roles—but does not give up being the diva—and the gay co-star who rips his shirt open whenever someone from the network happens to visit the set (referring to his six-pack abs as "job security"), among others.

"I've always wanted to be in an ensemble show," Longoria says. ""Housewives' was an ensemble show, and after 'Housewives' I was offered script after script after script that was like, 'You're the lead! You'd be the lead! You're the lead!' and I was like, 'But I want an ensemble show!' I fought to make sure we're all on the poster, I fought to make sure that we're all in the promos—because I want America to know this is a show about all of these people, not just a show about Ana Sophia." In addition to Longoria, the cast includes Jencarlos Canela, Diana Maria Riva, Jose



Moreno Brooks, Alex Meneses, Amaury Nolasco, Jadyn Maria and Izzy Diaz.

"Telenovela" is not the only current project for Longoria. The Longoria-produced Lifetime hit "Devious Maids" has been renewed for a fourth season and will return in 2016. She recently filmed the feature Low Riders, a look at the lives of enthusiasts of the re-emerging low-riding culture in Southern

California's Latino communities, which is also scheduled to be released in 2016. And she has been announced as a guest during the fourth season of the Jane Lynch-hosted "Hollywood Game Night" when it returns in January.
